Khaptad National Park Trekking difficulty

Khaptad National Park trekking is moderate, meaning it can be challenging but not too hard. The trails can be steep and uneven, with rocks and mud in some places, so it's essential to be careful where you step. You must walk for several hours daily, so you have to be in good physical shape. Regular exercise before the trek will make it easier.

The hike takes several days to complete. You must spend a few hours trekking, which can be tiring, especially with a backpack on your shoulder. So, you need to carry essentials like snacks, water, and extra clothes, which can add to the challenge.

While the altitude of Khaptad National Park isn't extremely high, it is higher than most people are used to. You might sometimes feel short of breath, but it's usually not severe. It's important to walk at your pace and take breaks when needed.

9 Days Khaptad National Park Itinerary

Day 1: Kathmandu to Dhangadhi

Take a flight from Kathmandu to Dhangadhi, a city in the Far-Western Region of Nepal. Spend the day exploring the city and preparing for the trek.

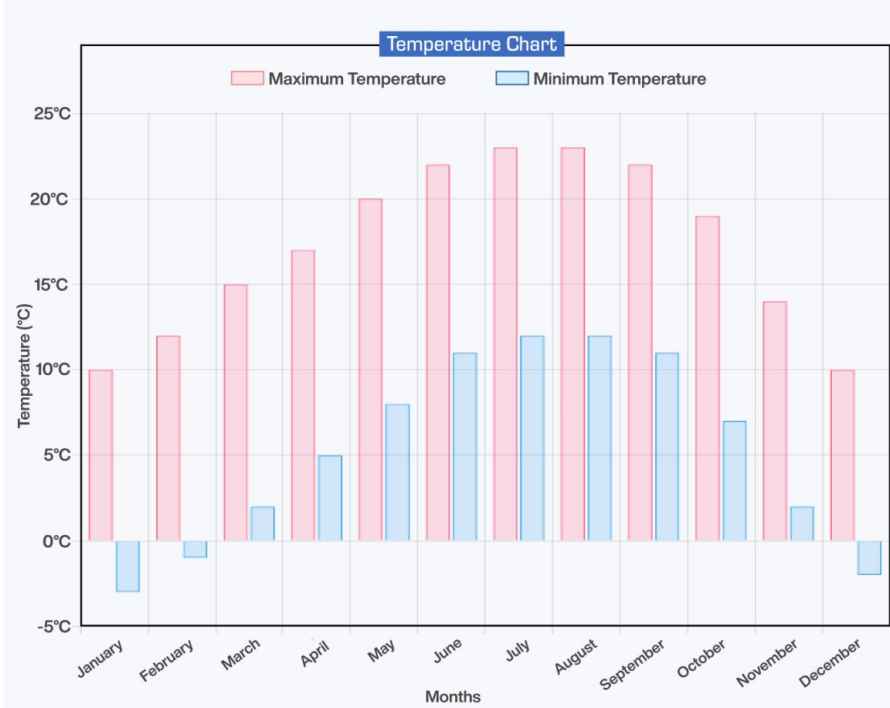
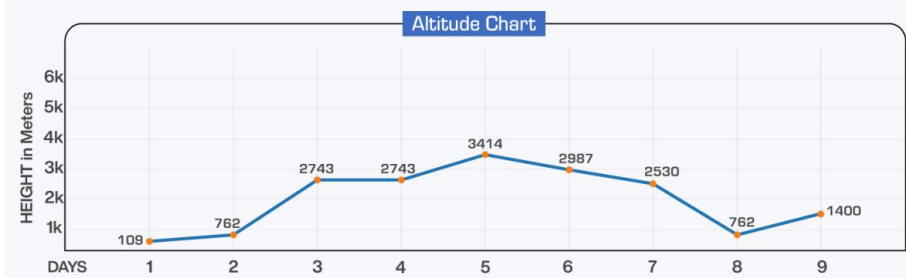

Flora and Fauna at Khaptad National Park

Khaptad National Park is located in the far-western region of Nepal and is known for its unique flora and fauna. Here are some of the species you can find at Khaptad National Park:

Flora

- Rhododendron: Khaptad is home to over 23 rhododendron species, including the national flower of Nepal, Rhododendron arboreum.
- Oak: Several species of oak trees are found in Khaptad, including the Quercus lanata and Quercus semecarpifolia.
- Pine: The park also has several species of pine trees, including Pinus roxburghii and Pinus wallichiana.
- Fir: Khaptad has a good population of fir trees, including Abies spectabilis and Abies pindrow.

Fauna

Khaptad National Park Route Option

The small and attractive Khaptad National Park is located at the crossroads of four districts: Bajhang, Doti, Achham, and Bajura. The Park covers a huge plateau inside the pahar, close to the south of the Great Himalayas. Trails connect the area to the isolated districts of Darchula, the Saipal and Api Himals, Rara Lake, and dozens of sites throughout the mid-hills.

From Kathmandu, you may drive or fly to Nepalgunj. Then, it's a 6-hour trip to the roadhead village of Silgadhi, where the main route leads to the Park headquarters. Alternatively, you might take a flight to Chainpur (Bajura District), Dipayal (Doti District), Kolti (Bajura District), or Sanphebagar (Achham District) and take one of the several minor trails to the park. This route begins in Silgadhi and ends in Sanphebagar, but the most popular route is to return to Silgadhi via the same trail.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the highest altitude reached during the Khaptad National Park Trekking?

The highest altitude reached during the Khaptad National Park Trekking is around 3,200 meters at Khaptad Daha.

What kind of accommodation is available during the trek?

There are basic lodges and tea houses available in the villages along the trekking route. However, it's advisable to bring your own camping gear if you prefer camping.

Is it necessary to hire a guide for the Khaptad National Park Trekking?

Hiring a guide is not mandatory for the Khaptad National Park Trekking, but it's highly recommended, especially if you are not familiar with the area or do not speak the local language. A guide can also help with navigation, accommodation, and provide information about the local culture and customs.

How do I get to Khaptad National Park?

How to go to Khaptad National Park in the most effective manner. Via Air: Visitors can fly directly to the Dhangadhi Airport in Nepal and then take a local taxi from there to Bajhang. Starting at Bajhang, the route to the national park begins.

In which district does Khaptad National Park lie?

In Nepal's Far-Western Region, a protected area called Khaptad National Park was established in 1984. It is 225 km² (87 sq mi) in size and has a height range of 1,400 m (4,600 ft) to 3,300 m. Four districts make up this area: Bajhang, Bajura, Achham, and Doti (10,800 ft).

Why is Khaptad famous?

Khaptad is one of the best places to visit during one's visit to Nepal. The main attraction of the Khaptad is the Khaptad National Park. Annually, a lot of visitors come to visit the Khaptad National Park. Because it is home to some of the most endangered species in Nepal, some of the most endangered species at the Khaptad National Park are The imperial pheasant (danphe), cuckoos, white-rumped vulture, peregrine falcon, bulbuls, and other birds that live in Khaptad National Park are well-known. Because of the abundance of these species, the national park has become a popular destination for birdwatchers.

What are the vegetation found in the Khaptad National Park?

224 kinds of medicinal herbs; grasslands and woods with subtropical, temperate, and subalpine vegetation

What are some of the added attraction of Khaptad National Park?

Khaptad Lake, Sahashra Linga (at 3,200 m, the highest point of the park), Tribeni, Ganesh Temple, Nagdhunga, and Kedardhunga are among the attractions.

Cancellation Policy

We understand that plans can change willy-nilly. However it is our responsibility to ensure fairness and transparency among our customers regarding our cancellation policy. So we kindly request all travelers to carefully review the cancellation and refund policy before confirming their trip.

After your trip starts, we cannot provide a refund for any voluntary withdrawal, cancellation, or early departure by the traveler. This means ***the full amount paid to us will not be refunded after the trip has begun.*** Likewise, if during the trip, any services such as accommodation, sightseeing, meals, transportation, etc. included in the itinerary/trip are not used by the customer, no refunds or reuse will be provided to whatever portion remains unused on the trip.

Also, please note that ***last-minute cancellations are non-refundable.*** You have to understand that many trip arrangements such as accommodation, transportation, permits, guides, and operational logistics are confirmed and pre-booked. Thus, cancellations made at the last minute create non-recoverable costs for the company and so do for our clients. In addition, cancellations made shortly before the departure date or after the trip has started will be considered as last-minute cancellations and will not be eligible for any refund.

Still, the company will use their discretion in setting the conditions for the refunds, therefore, few of the conditions mentioned are subject to change. The company holds every right to cancel the trips booked by the customers before it is guaranteed to run or an official agreement is signed. A trip is guaranteed to run once it has two fully paid travelers unless minimum numbers state otherwise.

Unfortunate circumstances such as unforeseen natural disaster, canceled flights, strike, industrial action, wars, riots, quarantine, government intervention, weather, the deteriorating health condition of a group member, etc. could lead to cancellation of trips. In such cases, the customer can either ask to get back the 90% of the total trip cost paid to the company (13% Government Tax will be deducted) or reuse the cost in an alternative trip with the same price, immediately, in the following season of the same year.

The company will require a written notice in case of any cancellation. Please ensure the date of the trip cancellation is the date on which the written cancellation is received by the company. If you cancel the trip anytime prior to the departure date of the actual trip, 90% of the total cost is reusable for a year or refund.

Trip Amendment

First and foremost, please note that all the amendment conditions are applied to the trips listed on this site only. Below are a few notes to take about the amendment fees in case of any changes during, while, or after the booking:

If the company receives a request on the booking amendments at least 60 days prior to the trip, a total of USD 50/person is charged to the customer. However, if the customer's request for a booking amendment in less than 60 days before the trip departure, then the charges will be as per the cancellation policy mentioned above. In case of any changes in the price of the trip during the procedure of booking and the amendments, the new cost will be applied to the trips. Please note that these changes might not be applied by the company, but can be levied upon the company by the third parties i.e. the hotels or the service providers working with the company.

Any changes, amendments, or additions in aggregation to the trips you have booked, for example, hotels, transfers, additional days, etc. will account for no additional fee.

Health Conditions

Nepal Alternative Treks places the highest priority on the safety and well-being of all travelers. We need to ensure the traveler's well-being and health condition at the time of booking. While travelers can participate without medical documentation, those with chronic illnesses or long-term medical conditions must obtain a doctor's consent before joining the trip. This is to ensure their health is not badly affected during the adventure and that they can safely enjoy the journey.

The company will not be responsible for any type of mishaps and will not bear the medical and evacuation expenses on behalf of the participant. Therefore, we request our clients to consult their doctors for a thorough checkup and vaccination before booking a trip with us. In addition, clients with specific health needs or concerns should inform the Company in advance. This allows us to provide guidance and, if required, arrange additional services to make the trip safer and more comfortable. If needed, clients may also request additional services related to the length of the trip or stay in the country of travel.

Weather and other unfavorable conditions

Clients should be well aware of the unpredictability of the weather conditions in the mountainous regions. The unfortunate weather conditions, especially in the Everest, Jomsom, and Kanchenjunga regions, can sometimes lead to unfavorable circumstances that include delay or cancellation of flights. The Company will cover the expenses of accommodations and food in the departing location until the arrangement of flights is done. However, the Company holds every right to reroute the original trip or transports which will be in favor of the situation without any addition in the cost. Please note that the company will not be responsible for any missed international flights, losses caused by Altitude Sickness, or any other unpredictable circumstances, and the participants will have to pay all the charges incurred. Nonetheless, the Company will connect and assist you to make the necessary alternative arrangements, but, the additional charge will be covered by the customers themselves.

Regardless of stating every condition and information about the trips on the website and brochures of the Company, we will not be responsible for the unforeseeable situations that may arise before or during the trips. The Company will, however, try its level best to give prior notice about it and take alternate strategies to deal with it. These booking conditions may only be waived in special circumstances, and in writing, by a letter from the Chief of the Company. Note that all the legal agreements set up and signed between the client and the Company shall be subjected to and governed by the Nepalese law.

Note: All the Terms and Conditions mentioned are prepared as per the laws of the Government of Nepal and is governed by them. Therefore, only the head of the Company gets to intervene and holds the authority to make any amendments.

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
